Participants should consider how the design can enhance guest experiences, promote community engagement, and contribute to the cultural landscape of the area. Ultimately, this competition seeks to highlight the importance of adaptive reuse as a sustainable practice that not only addresses contemporary needs but also preserves the stories and values of the past, paving the way for a more vibrant and interconnected urban environment.

Objective

The Building Program

The proposed hotel should encompass a diverse array of functional spaces designed to enhance guest experiences while respecting the historical integrity of the existing structure. The building program includes the following key components:

- Guest Accommodations
- Public Spaces

- Meeting and Event Spaces
- Amenities
- Back-of-House Facilities
- Sustainability Features
- Historical Integration

Site

For this competition, participants are encouraged to select an existing building or site that inspires them for their adaptive reuse hotel project. The chosen site should ideally possess historical significance or architectural value, providing a rich context for the transformation into a modern hospitality space. This flexibility allows participants to engage with various types of structures, from industrial warehouses and historic homes to former commercial buildings and cultural landmarks.

Sustainability

Sustainability is a fundamental aspect of the Adaptive Reuse Hotel Competition. Participants are required to incorporate sustainable practices and strategies throughout their design proposals.

Project Proposal Requirements

Participants must submit a project proposal that includes:

- A clear and compelling design narrative explaining the concept.
- Detailed floor plans, elevations, and sections that illustrate the spatial organization and functional layout.
- Renderings or visualizations that convey the aesthetic quality and experience.
- A site plan.

Submission Requirements

File Format:

• All entries must be submitted as a single PDF document.

Sheets:

- Minimum of 3 sheets, maximum of 6 sheets.
- Each sheet should include designs, drawings, and views that effectively communicate the project concept.

Text Explanation:

- Each sheet must contain explanatory text that describes and supports your design decisions.
- Text should be clear and concise, highlighting the main ideas and features of the project.

Content to Include (per sheet):

- Design Concepts: Conceptual drawings, diagrams, and sketches.
- Plans, Elevations, and Sections: Architectural plans, cross-sections, and elevations.
- Views and Renderings: 3D views, perspectives, or rendered images of the project.
- Diagrams: Illustrations explaining circulation, spatial relationships, environmental or structural concepts.

Resolution and Quality:

• All sheets should be high-quality, legible, and visually clear.

File Size:

• The total file size should not exceed 20 MB.

Naming Convention:

The file should be named as: CompetitionName_ParticipationCode.pdf

Anonymity:

 No names, logos, or identifying marks should appear on any of the submitted sheets to ensure anonymity during judging.
