Objective

The primary objective of this competition is to challenge participants to conceive a microhome that encapsulates the essence of compact, efficient living while thoughtfully addressing the complex issues of urban density, affordability, and sustainability. As urban populations swell and available living spaces shrink, the demand for innovative housing solutions that make the most of limited space has become increasingly urgent.

Participants are tasked with designing a microhome that not only meets the basic requirements of shelter but also enhances the quality of life for its occupants. The goal is to reimagine the concept of "home" within a small footprint, where every square meter is optimized for functionality, comfort, and aesthetic appeal.

The Building Program

Participants are required to design a microhome with the following programmatic elements:

- Living Space: A multi-functional area that serves as a living room, dining area, and workspace.
- Sleeping Area: A space that provides comfort and privacy for rest, which can be integrated or separate from the living space.
- Kitchen: A compact and efficient kitchen area equipped with essential appliances and storage.
- Bathroom: A fully functional bathroom with necessary amenities.
- Storage: Adequate storage solutions that blend seamlessly with the overall design.

Site

Participants can choose an urban site of their preference, whether a vacant plot, rooftop, or infill location. The site should reflect the challenges of high-density urban living and provide context for the microhome design. Participants are encouraged to select a site that aligns with their design narrative and enhances the livability of the microhome.

Sustainability

Sustainability is a key criterion in this competition. Participants should incorporate sustainable design principles, such as:

- Use of eco-friendly and locally sourced materials.
- Energy-efficient systems and renewable energy integration.
- Water conservation measures and waste management solutions.
- Design strategies that reduce the environmental impact of the microhome.

Project Proposal Requirements

Participants must submit a project proposal that includes:

- A clear and compelling design narrative explaining the concept and rationale behind the microhome.
- Detailed floor plans, elevations, and sections that illustrate the spatial organization and functional layout of the microhome.
- Renderings or visualizations that convey the aesthetic quality and experience of the microhome.
- A site plan that demonstrates the relationship between the microhome and its urban context.

Timeline

- Registration Deadline: 31st May 2025
- Submission Deadline: 5th June 2025
- Jury Evaluation: July 1st – August 31st 2025
- Winners Announcement: September 5th 2025

Submission Requirements

File Format:

- All entries must be submitted as a single PDF document.

Sheets:

- Minimum of 3 sheets, maximum of 6 sheets.
- Each sheet should include designs, drawings, and views that effectively communicate the project concept.

Text Explanation:

- Each sheet must contain explanatory text that describes and supports your design decisions.
- Text should be clear and concise, highlighting the main ideas and features of the project.

Content to Include (per sheet):

- Design Concepts: Conceptual drawings, diagrams, and sketches.
- Plans, Elevations, and Sections: Architectural plans, cross-sections, and elevations.
- Views and Renderings: 3D views, perspectives, or rendered images of the project.
- Diagrams: Illustrations explaining circulation, spatial relationships, environmental or structural concepts.

Resolution and Quality:

- All sheets should be high-quality, legible, and visually clear.

File Size:

- The total file size should not exceed 20 MB.

Naming Convention:

- The file should be named as: CompetitionName_ParticipationCode.pdf

Anonymity:

- No names, logos, or identifying marks should appear on any of the submitted sheets to ensure anonymity during judging.
